ADULT MINISTRIES (YOUNG AND NOT-SO-YOUNG)

THE YOUNG ADULT LEAGUE (YAL) is almost extinct in the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese. So, we are starting YAM (Young Adult Ministry). YAM is a ministry for, as the name states, young adults. A young adult, for the purposes of this organization, is a person 18 years through 30 years of age.

We will start another new ministry for the 30-, 40-, and 50-year-olds. This ministry will be called SAM (Single Adult Ministry). I am looking for volunteers to start up this ministry. So, please call me! My cell phone number is 571-213-1109.

Now, back to YAM. There is a great need for fellowship for this age group. Saint Katherine has approximately 10 young adults move into our area each year, from all over the country. Being away from home, alone, in a new place, away from the church in which they grew up, and away from other Orthodox Christians, can be very difficult.

We need to help our young adults realize that God should be a part of their new lives. The Church wants them to use their talents and give of their time to serve Christ and His Church. We must give our young adults an opportunity to live their faith. Those who have abandoned their church and faith (or put them on the back burner) while away from their parents, in college, and/or starting their careers, need to reunite with Christ and each other.

We have a plan! We need all members of our parish to get the word out! All young adults (remember, ages 18-30) are invited to a life-changing event. We will meet in the Meletis Charuhas Hall for breakfast and our first planning session on Sunday, September 18 at 1:00pm

It is important to take inventory and assess the needs of our young adults:

1. What is currently happening with the ministry at our parish?
2. How are young adults involved in the life of the church?
3. What is the make-up of our young adult population?
4. What is the history of Young Adult Ministry in our parish?
5. How do OCF college students participate in the life of our parish?
6. What do we want for our young adult program?
7. How do we find our young adults?
8. What barriers do we face?
9. What are these young adults already involved in that might conflict with this ministry's activities?
10. Who are the important people to have involved in the ministry?
11. Do we do anything with the young adults in nearby parishes?
12. What do the young adults want from this ministry?

After completing the assessment of our YAM, we will address the following:

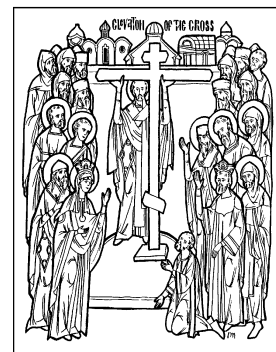
1. What purpose will this ministry serve?

4. When is the best time to hold activities?

CATECHETICAL (SUNDAY) SCHOOL

OUR LORD AND SAVIOR JESUS CHRIST SAID, "Let the little children come to Me, and do not forbid them; for of such is the kingdom of heaven" (Saint Matthew 19:14). Parents, please bring your child/children *regularly* to *both* Catechetical (Sunday) School and Church. Through both experiences our children will be drawn closer to Christ and grow in Christian knowledge. One of God's Ten Commandments is to "Keep the Sabbath Day Holy." For us Orthodox Christians, the Sabbath Day is Sunday. Sunday is the time for Catechetical School and Church.

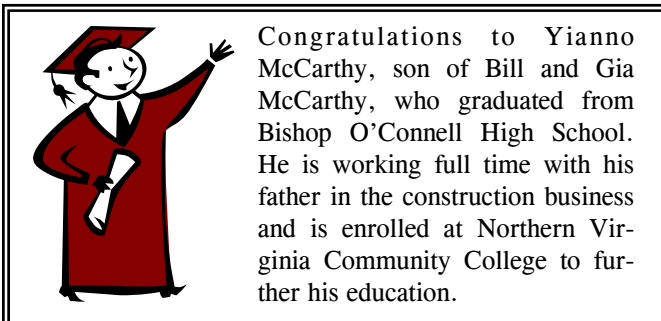
Indeed, we are fortunate here at Saint Katherine in that our Catechetical (Sunday) School time frame allows parents to take their child/children to one of our two Divine Liturgies—the one that begins at 8:00am or the one that commences at 10:30am. This format allows parents to bring their child/children to Catechetical School and worship together in Church. May we emphasize that *central* to the Catechetical School experience is the participation in one of the two Divine Liturgies.

During the time that children are in Catechetical School, parents can participate in either of the two classes for adults—the one entitled *Journey to Orthodoxy* and the other a Bible Study.

It will truly be a joy to see all of our children back to Catechetical (Sunday) School when classes begin on September 18. Fr. Costa will pray with us that day promptly at 9:30am in the Meletis Charuhas Hall after which we will dismiss to the downstairs classrooms. Parents may complete the registration form for their child/children on Sunday, September 11 immediately after Divine Liturgy in the hall where the coffee hour takes place or the next week during Catechetical School, downstairs in the rooms where music instruction normally occurs. Our parents have been very responsive to our Catechetical School program in the past, and we are very much looking forward to another great year seeing our youth learn about our God and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ as well as worshipping as a family in Church.

HOW CAN I MANAGE MY GRIEF?

Identify Your Feelings

Sometimes after a loss, it is hard to figure out exactly what you are feeling. You may have several feelings at the same time or conflicting feelings, such as sadness and relief. Writing is a good way to identify what you are feeling.

Writing about what you feel can:

1. Stimulate thinking and help you organize and analyze your thoughts.
2. Deepen your understanding of a situation and may help you get in touch with feelings you had not recognized before.
3. Prompt you to reflect on what is happening to you. This can help you put things into perspective and come to an understanding of how the changes affect your life.

When you are ready to write:

1. Set aside time to write.
2. Choose a private, comfortable place to do your writing.
3. Choose a method of writing. You may choose to write a poem, story, or letter to your loved one, for example.
4. Don't worry about how well you write. Write about everyday occurrences or conversations you have had.
5. Write what you feel. Don't screen your thoughts; give yourself permission to write whatever comes to mind. Strong feelings (such as fear, anger, or frustration) may arise. Write about simple pleasures and joys you have experienced, too. If you have concerns about your strong feelings, talk with a trusted friend, member of the clergy, or mental health professional.

Accept Your Feelings

1. Talk with people about how you are feeling. Resist the urge to be quiet around, or avoid, people. If you are having trouble talking about your feelings with family members and friends, consider joining a bereavement support group.
2. Express your emotions. You may feel that this is a sign of weakness or that you won't be able to control yourself if you show your emotions. None of these is true. However, if you are afraid that you might harm yourself or someone else if you express an emotion, talk with someone you trust—Fr. Costa, your doctor, or a mental health professional about your concerns.
3. Be patient and kind to yourself. Your feelings may be unpredictable and uncomfortable. Remind yourself that your uncomfortable feelings are expected and will fade as time goes on.

Ο ΑΓΙΟΣ ΚΟΣΜΑΣ Ο ΑΙΤΟΛΟΣ

(Συνέχεια από το προηγούμενο)

«ΧΤΙΣΤΕ ΣΧΟΛΕΙΑ, ΧΤΙΣΤΕ ΣΧΟΛΕΙΑ... Ο Χριστός λειτουργείται στα φώτη όχι στα σκότη. Νοιώστε το... Το Γένος μας αγρίεψε από την αμάθεια... Καλύτερα να έχης Ελληνικόν Σχολείον, παρά να έχης βρύσες και ποτάμια...». Έτσι επέτυχε ο πατρο-Κοσμάς, να κτιστούν πάνω από 210 Ελληνικά Σχολεία και άλλα 1.100 άρχισαν να λειτουργούν. 1.400 περίπου φάροι άναψαν.

«Το κορμί σας ως το κάψουν, ως το τηγανίσουν, τα πράγματά σας ως σας τα πάρουν. Μη σας μέλλει. Δώσατέ τα, δεν είναι δικά σας. **Ψυχή και Χριστός** σας χρειάζονται. Αυτά τα δύο να τα φυλάγετε, να μην τα χάσετε». Κατ' αυτόν τον τρόπο κατάφερε να αναχαιτίζει τον χείμαρρο του εξισλαμισμού.

«Την Κυριακή να μην κάνουμε εμπόριο, γιατί βάζουμε φωτιά στο σπίτι μας». Μιλούσε με θέρμη και πάθος για την ιερότητα της Κυριακής, γι' αυτό και πέτυχε την καθιέρωση της Κυριακής αργίας.

Άλλοτε πάλι έλεγε: «Όσοι δεν αγαπούν τα ζώα και τα φυτά, θα ζουν φτωχικά». Κάθε φορά κήρυττε και για την χαρά της εργασίας και έπλεκε εγκώμια για τους τίμιους εργατές. Συνιστούσε την κατάπαυση της ληστείας, την αγνότητα της καρδιάς ως το μεγαλύτερο κόσμημα. Και οι άνθρωποι, μετά από κάθε κήρυγμα του πατρο-Κοσμά, μετανοούσαν, τα μίση και οι ληστείες σταματούσαν. Οι ανελεήμονες γίνονταν ελεήμονες και το χωριό γινόταν μία οικογένεια.

Για τον πατρο-Κοσμά Ελληνισμός και Χριστιανισμός ήταν ταυτόσημα. «Διατηρήσατε, έλεγε, γενναία και ατρόμητα την ιερή μας θρησκεία και την γλώσσα την Ελληνική των πατέρων... Χωρίς αυτά το Έθνος καταστρέφεται». Χάρις σ' αυτά τα κηρύγματα η βλαχική διάλεκτος εξαφανίστηκε σχεδόν τελείως σε ορισμένες περιοχές.

Και επαναλάμβανε, «εγώ δουλεύω για το Γένος» και εμύησε τους κλέφτες της Πίνδου στη Μεγάλη Ιδέα. Ο πατρο-Κοσμάς ήταν ο κατ' εξοχήν άγιος της κλεφτουριάς. Ο Δίπλας και οι Κατσαντωνάιοι μαρτύρησαν έχοντας στα χείλη τους το όνομα του πατρο-Κοσμά. Κάθε φορά που τελείωνε το κήρυγμα συγκέντρωνε τους πιο δυναμικούς και έμπιστους και τους μούσε στην ιδέα της Λευτεριάς. Και μ' αυτό τον τρόπο δημιουργούσε πυρήνες απελευθέρωσης του Γένους. Γι' αυτό λοιπόν η εθνική του δράση είναι πρωτοποριακή. Κανένας δεν μπορεί να συγκριθεί μαζί του. Δεν φοβόταν το μαρτύριο. «Τον Χριστόν μου παρακαλώ, έλεγε, να με αξιώσει να χύσω και εγώ το αίμα μου γά την αγάπη Του». Και έτσι έγινε. Έχυσε το αίμα του. Οι Εβραίοι εχθροί του, ακριβοπλήρωσαν τους Τούρκους, που αν και τον αγαπούσαν, εν τούτοις τον σκότωσαν, μη μπορώντας να αντισταθούν στην λάμψη του μαμμωνά.

Ο πατρο-Κοσμάς προικισμένος με το προφητικό χάρισμα τόχε προβλέψει. Έτσι τον Μάρτιο του 1779, λίγους μήνες μετά το μαρτύριό του, έγραφε στον αδελφό του Χρύσανθο:

GREEK SCHOOL REGISTRATION FORM

THE GENERAL NORM of acceptance for enrollment in Saint Katherine Greek School is children of registered stewards and adult stewards of Saint Katherine Greek Orthodox Church. Students entering Pre-Kindergarten must be 4 years old and Kindergarten must be 5 years old by August 31, 2011. A current copy of their immunization records must be presented at registration.

Tuition for stewards is \$450 for the 1st child, \$425 for the 2nd child, \$400 for the 3rd child, and \$400 for the 4th child.

"Our time there was very short, but what a rich and challenging experience," Gregory says. "The people were very warm and welcoming and the kids were just like kids everywhere, energetic and loving. But there are many challenges in the larger community that press on the faithful there: alcohol and drugs, domestic violence and abuse, as well as an overall apathy to church life that's hard to understand, given the warmth of their priest, Fr. Gregory Parker, and his family. God willing, there will be a chance for a team to return to Old Harbor in 2012, but in the meantime, please keep Fr. Gregory, Three Saints parishioners, and all the residents of Old Harbor in the forefront of your prayers!"

AGAPE Canister Program: The Agape Canister Program is a philanthropic development program of the Orthodox Christian Mission Center that is dedicated to meeting the needs of children, families, and communities throughout the world. 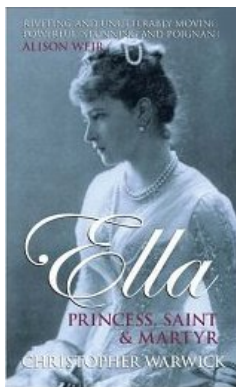

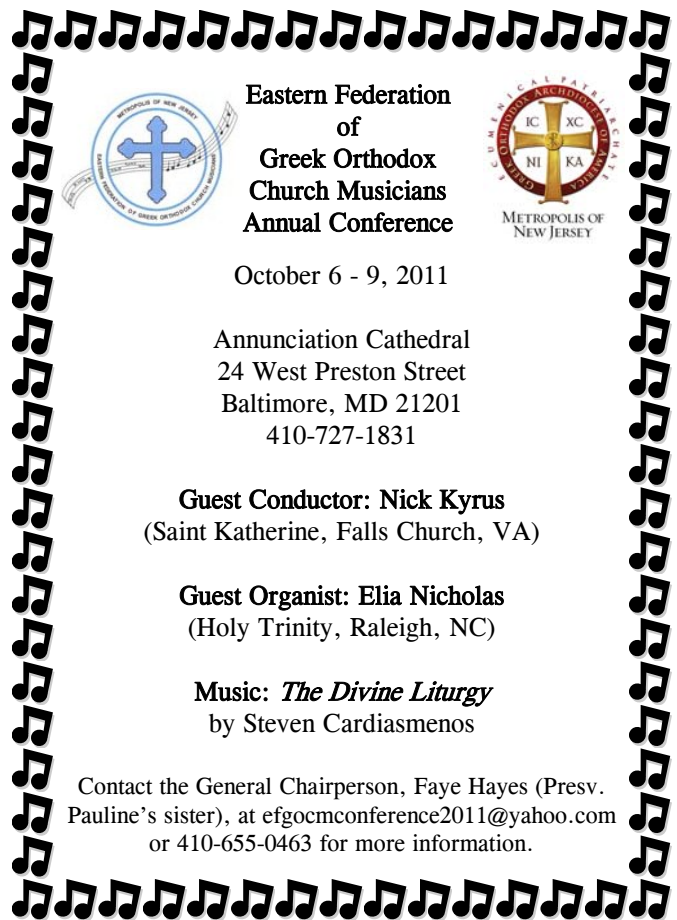

A MAN OF GREAT ACCOMPLISHMENT: DR. PETER NEFF

Teri-Ross Icyda, D.M.D. (*Journal of Craniomandibular Practice*, July 2011, Vol. 29, No.3)

FEW AMONG US have been able to raise the level of care for our patients and our profession. Dr. Peter Neff is one of these distinguished individuals who has dedicated his life's work to the advancement of the dental profession, elevating both the science and the standard of patient care.

Peter was born Panayotis Andrew Nafpliotis, in Egypt, to Greek parents. Young Panayotis excelled at sports in Cairo. Although he had a celebrated track career, winning the 100-meter dash at the 1949 Pan-Hellenic games held in Cairo and organizing the first track team at the College of Steubenville in 1953, Peter Neff's childhood dreams of going into physical education were supplanted by dentistry.

In 1950, Peter's plans of attending the Sorbonne were changed by the urges of a cousin, who urged him to, instead, come to America and attend the College of Steubenville. Peter was accepted to the College of Steubenville as one of its first foreign students, arriving in America knowing only two words of English. He attributes his rapid assimilation of the language to his devotion to reading the dictionary. Because of the government's unwillingness to allow Peter's parents to send funds to the United States, the industrious Peter worked many jobs to help support himself in his pursuit of a degree in chemical engineering.

Through a distinguished career in the Marines, Peter Neff received his U.S. citizenship. In 1963, Dr. Neff

graduated from Georgetown Dental School and moved to Florida as a resident to start a private practice, only to be asked to return to Georgetown Dental as faculty. As faculty, Dr. Neff rose through the ranks of academia by dedication, research, publication, and single-minded determination to improve dental education. In 1975, he published what has been recognized as the "definitive textbook on the study of temporomandibular joint function, the masticatory system, and related jaw, biting, and chewing problems."¹ His efforts and achievements resulted in full Professorship at Georgetown.

Dr. Peter Neff's accomplishments are known the world over, leading him to treat the late King Hussein of Jordan, who awarded Dr. Neff with the "Alkawab" decoration of the Star of the Second Order, for his dental services.

Peter Neff has traveled the world enabling and encouraging our profession to have a deeper understanding of the biological principles of comprehensive care of the craniomandibular complex. There have been few among our profession who have been able to raise the level of care for our patients and Dentistry, and our profession will always appreciate the courage and determination of Dr. Peter (Panayotis) Andrew Neff (Nafpliotis).

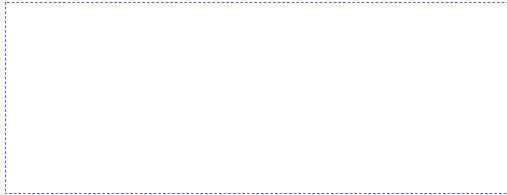
